



The Tennessee Department of Treasury hosts 15 internships from various fields of study each Summer. We are still seeking candidates for 2026 internships.

Each year, Treasury hires interns from universities across the state. We would appreciate your help in getting this message to students in your respective department by sharing our [Treasury Internship webpage](#).

This internship is a 10-week, educational, experiential, and project-based learning opportunity. Compensation starts at \$25 per hour. We offer undergraduate and graduate students a chance to participate in the operations of a State constitutional office.

Treasury interns are assigned meaningful projects for their program areas, the results of which are presented at the conclusion of the internship to senior staff and university representatives. Project

results will be utilized for the benefit of the State of Tennessee. The internship will be primarily a virtual work schedule, 8 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. Monday-Friday, June 1 – Aug. 7, with some in-person projects and events scheduled throughout the summer.
